## 4<sup>th</sup> WORKSHOP OF EASTERN PARTNERSHIP ENERGY REGULATORY BODIES 26- 27 March 2015 – Chisinau

#### "UNDERSTANDING THE IMPACT OF REGULATORY INCENTIVES"

Venue: Republican Palace - 16, Maria Cibotari street, Chisinau, Moldova

<u>Background:</u> In accordance with the Eastern Partnership work program 2012-2013 and 2014-2017, the Council of European Energy Regulators (CEER) and the European Commission jointly organized three specialized workshops with the energy regulatory bodies from the Eastern Partnership Countries. The first workshop took place in Vienna on 30-31 May 2012 to exchange experience on the role, powers and challenges of energy regulatory bodies. The second workshop took place in Tbilisi on 18-19 June 2013 and focused on regulatory tools in support of infrastructure development, interconnection and diversification of supply. The 3<sup>rd</sup> workshop took place in London on 27-28 May 2014 and dealt with regional electricity markets.

These workshops reflect CEER's contribution to the EaP-objective "approximation of regulatory frameworks".

<u>Workshop objectives</u>: The overall aim of the workshop is to share the principles of various tariff models and the impact of cost-reflective energy prices on the behavior of different market participants (grid operators, investors, customers) in the EU and the Eastern Partner countries. The results of the discussions shall be reported to the Eastern Partnership Platform on Energy Security's next meeting to be held before the Eastern Partnership Summit in Riga (date tbc).

<u>Field Trip:</u> The workshop will include a field trip to the reverse flow pipeline between Moldova and Romania (Ungheni-laşi pipeline) located in Ungheni (ca. 2 hours away from Chisinau). This reverse flow pipeline is a major contribution to enhanced Moldovan and EU energy security. As this workshop is held in the framework of the Eastern partnership platform on energy, this field trip is considered to be of high value to participants as they will have the chance to experience how reverse flow pipelines are operated and used in practice.

This field trip will take place on the second day (27 March).







<u>Organization</u>: The workshop involves speakers from the regulatory bodies of the Eastern partner countries as well as regulators from the EU. The perspectives from other relevant regional associations as well as from EU institutions will also be presented. Overall, the workshop intends to give sufficient room for questions and discussions as well as informal networking.

### **Expected Outcome:**

- Workshop participants will have a better understanding of the various methodologies used to calculate tariffs across Europe and the Eastern Partnership region.
- The principle of cost reflective tariffs will be examined particularly with a view to understand its individual consequences for various market participants.
- Conflicting objectives and how to manage these as a regulator will be discussed.
- Regulatory incentives aiming at attracting investments will be looked at in particular.
- The question of how to manage the transition to cost-reflective tariffs/prices and the role of regulators in this process will be analyzed.

<u>Target audience</u>: Representatives of the Eastern Partnership's regulatory community, i.e. regulatory bodies of Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine and the regulators from the 28 EU Member States as well as other relevant stakeholders.

Interpretation: Simultaneous interpretation English/Russian will be available.
